BTC: FISH 170 (54 clock hours/4 credits)

- Describe and demonstrate the ponding of fry and equipment used.
- Identify and use log forms to be filled out for the State and our hatchery.
- Properly fill out and use the records/forms needed for the fish you are rearing.
- Describe predators in our area and the proper nonlethal control of each.
